REQUIREMENTS

2. English language proficiency requirement:

- IELTS: 6.5 with no section less than 6.0 **OR**
- TOEFL: 90 (iBT) with no band less than 20

NOTE: *Conditional Acceptance* is offered to students who have IELTS 6.0 (each section 5.5) or TOEFL 79 (each section 17). During the conditional period, you will have an opportunity to re-submit another test score. If your new test score does not meet the requirement then there is an opportunity to take a 4-week UAP "University Admissions Preparation" course online or in-person at UVic in August to fulfill the UVic English Language Requirement.

APPLICATION MATERIALS

Prepare Supplemental Application

This is your chance to highlight any work, leadership, academic, volunteer and/or life experiences, and to reflect on how these experiences have allowed you to learn, develop and grow. 1. Current resume

- Two pages maximum; only references may extend on to a third page
- Please note that reference letters will not be considered in the admission process

2. Personal statement: your background and motivation

- Please provide specific examples
- Minimum 250 words in paragraph format.

3. Impact statement: your personal road map

Gustavson BCom students create a real impact in local and global communities. Please tell us: what impact do you intend to create, and how will the Gustavson BCom program help you to do this?

- Please provide specific examples
- Minimum 200 words in paragraph format
- We encourage you to think about your future goals, and how our unique program features will contribute to your success.

Combine all your supplemental application documents into one PDF file and add them to your application.
